## Year 10 People and Places: Merri Creek Field Report

This task is a field report that will demonstrate your ability to conduct fieldwork, analyse your data and present work using geographical conventions.

This assignment is due on: Wednesday, 28th October 2015

You will complete all of the activities outlined in this assessment task and present them using geographical presentation conventions such as BOLTSSNA.

### **Instructions:**

You will visit the Merri Creek in Brunswick and Northcote to carry out fieldwork on rivers and the management issues encountered when building on a floodplain. You will be attempting to answer the question:

'Is the Merri Creek a well-managed waterway?'

### FIELDWORK REPORT

- To be worked in class before and after the fieldwork is undertaken, as well as for homework.
- You can work in groups to gather information BUT you MUST PREPARE and SUBMIT YOUR OWN REPORT.

NOTE: All maps and images used should be completed using BOLTSSNA.

### A: Location

- 1. Show the study area using a <u>regional</u> map of Melbourne. You should mark and name this area.
- 2. Describe the **relative location** of the study area from the Melbourne CBD.
- 3. Mark the path taken. Use a <u>legend (key)</u> to show this path. You will be <u>adding</u> to this map in *Section C: Landscape*.

### **B**: History

- 1. What did the Merri Creek use to be like (pre-European history)?
- 2. What happened to the Merri Creek after European settlement?
- 3. What is it like now?

### C: Landscape

- 1. You will need to draw 3 profiles of Merri Creek.
  - a. You should label all geographical features. Use your observations and this profile to describe the physical landscape.
  - b. Do the profiles change at all? How do they change? Why do you think they change?
- 2. Use annotated photos of at least 5 sites (your choice) to describe the physical and human landscape. Things that you can identify include:
  - a. **Human landscape**: buildings, roads, railways, bridges, car parks, landmarks e.g. statues, etc.
  - b. **Physical landscape**: streams, trees, open spaces, grassy areas, coastal areas, rocks, marshland, relief (whether the land is steep or flat), etc.
  - c. Remember to <u>identify the location</u> of each site.
- 3. You will need to create an <u>overlay</u> for your map that shows all the areas that can be affected by flooding. Remember to take photographs of the maps showing these areas.

### D: Land Use

- 1. You must identify the types of current land use around the Merri Creek and provide evidence (photos).
- 2. You need to complete a survey of land use.
  - a. You will need to keep a record of how many people we see and how they are using the Merri.
  - b. This information should be presented as a graph in your field report.
  - c. You will need to **analyse** these results what do they tell us about the Merri Creek area?

### E: Issues

- 1. **Describe** the impact that human use has had on i) the landscape and/or ii) people. Where possible, use **evidence** e.g. photographs and satellite images to support your answer. You might find a graphic organiser useful to map your thinking here.
- 2. **Explain** what <u>issues have arisen</u> as a result of human impact on this environment. What are the problems that the area now faces due to human use of the environment?

3. **How** has the environment affected people living in the area?

## F: Managing the issues

- 1. What <u>management strategies</u> have been <u>implemented</u> (put in place) to address issues relating to the Merri Creek?
- 2. Provide <u>evidence</u> of these strategies e.g. sketches, photos, videos.

One way of presenting your findings is to use a table. See below. You can include **photos** in the evidence boxes.

## **G**: Conclusion

1. Complete a SWOT chart on the Merri Creek

2. Write a **conclusion** stating your overall opinion of whether the Merri Creek is a well-managed waterway <u>based on your findings and evidence</u>.

## **H: Evaluation and Recommendations**

1. Suggest <u>changes</u> that could <u>improve</u> the management of the Merri Creek. **Explain** how these changes will improve the management of the Merri Creek.

Don't forget - you need to include a <u>bibliography</u> that records the sources of the images and information used in this field report.
